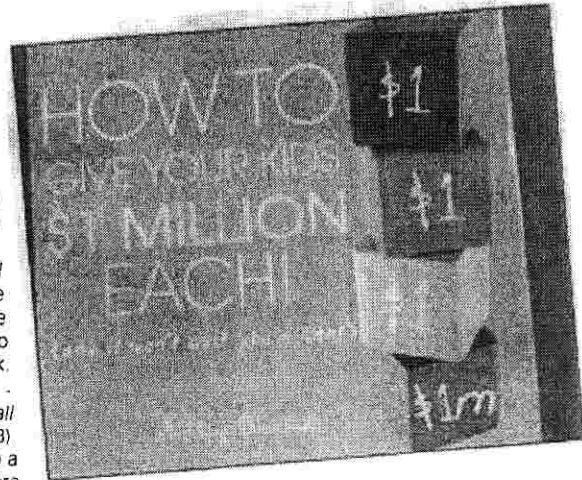
ping Centre.
